Medieval monasticism emphasized a contemplative lifestyle.

5. capacious adj..

Capable of containing a large quantity; spacious or roomy.

The new addition provided a capacious working area for his many computer peripherals

6. <u>altruism</u>n.

Unselfish concern for the welfare of others; selflessness

The altruistic efforts of the missionaries was exemplary.

7. capitulate v.

To surrender under specified conditions; come to terms

The demoralized Japanese forces finally capitulated after the Hiroshima bombing.

A commonplace remark or notion; a platitude; cliche

His bromidic sermons induced a somnolent atmosphere every week.

A simultaneous discharge of firearms. A sudden outburst, as of cheers or praise.

A forceful verbal or written assault.

The political pundit delivered a vitriolic salvo against the EPA.
